Excerpts from the earliest & most recent graduation speeches:

1976: (enrollment 25) I started attending Harmony School in the fall of 1974. I went there not knowing what to expect, or what they would expect of me. At first all I could do was feel uncomfortable. My dealings with no less than seven public schools had made me this way. It took me a couple of months to realize Harmony wasn't a place where I had to be there 8 to 3, had to make straight "A's" to be on someone's honor roll, had to be with a "teacher" who was there to give you xeroxed lessons, but not much more. Harmony turned out to be a lot different. Harmony's "learn at your own pace" philosophy has really meant a lot to me. At Harmony I found that I could learn at my own pace and not feel inferior, therefore making learning enjoyable, not a chore. Another thing I'd like to mention is the closeness here at Harmony. I tend to think of the school as a big family. By this I mean that everyone is willing to help each other grow and thrive and everyone plays a major part. No one is neglected and everyone is needed. Flexibility is also important at Harmony. While learning the basics you're allowed to explore other fields you're interested in. Through Harmony I came into contact with people who knew a lot about these fields. These have been valuable learning experiences and now I know what I want to do and what goals I want to accomplish.

1991: (enrollment 140) When I came to Harmony 2¹/₂ years ago I'd already felt I'd been here for years. People have asked me every year if I was graduating that year, I always smiled and said "no", thinking how much longer I still had until I would graduate. Now I am graduating at last. I am both sad and excited to leave Harmony. I have had a wonderful time. This year has been the most challenging, educational and exciting year of my life. I learned things that I could never have learned any other way (spending three months in Costa Rica). Besides learning Spanish, I learned so much about history, culture and lives of Central American people. I will never be the same person I was before the trip. I learned things about myself, and became much more aware of my capabilities and power. Harmony has taught me a lot about working and living in a community, making group decisions, dealing with problems, planning trips. It is so important to be able to work in a community, dealing with other people honestly and openly. In the face of such severe global problems, it is important to have schools like Harmony that encourage people to think creatively, and independently. Harmony has acted as a spring board for me, allowing me to explore new areas of the world and myself.

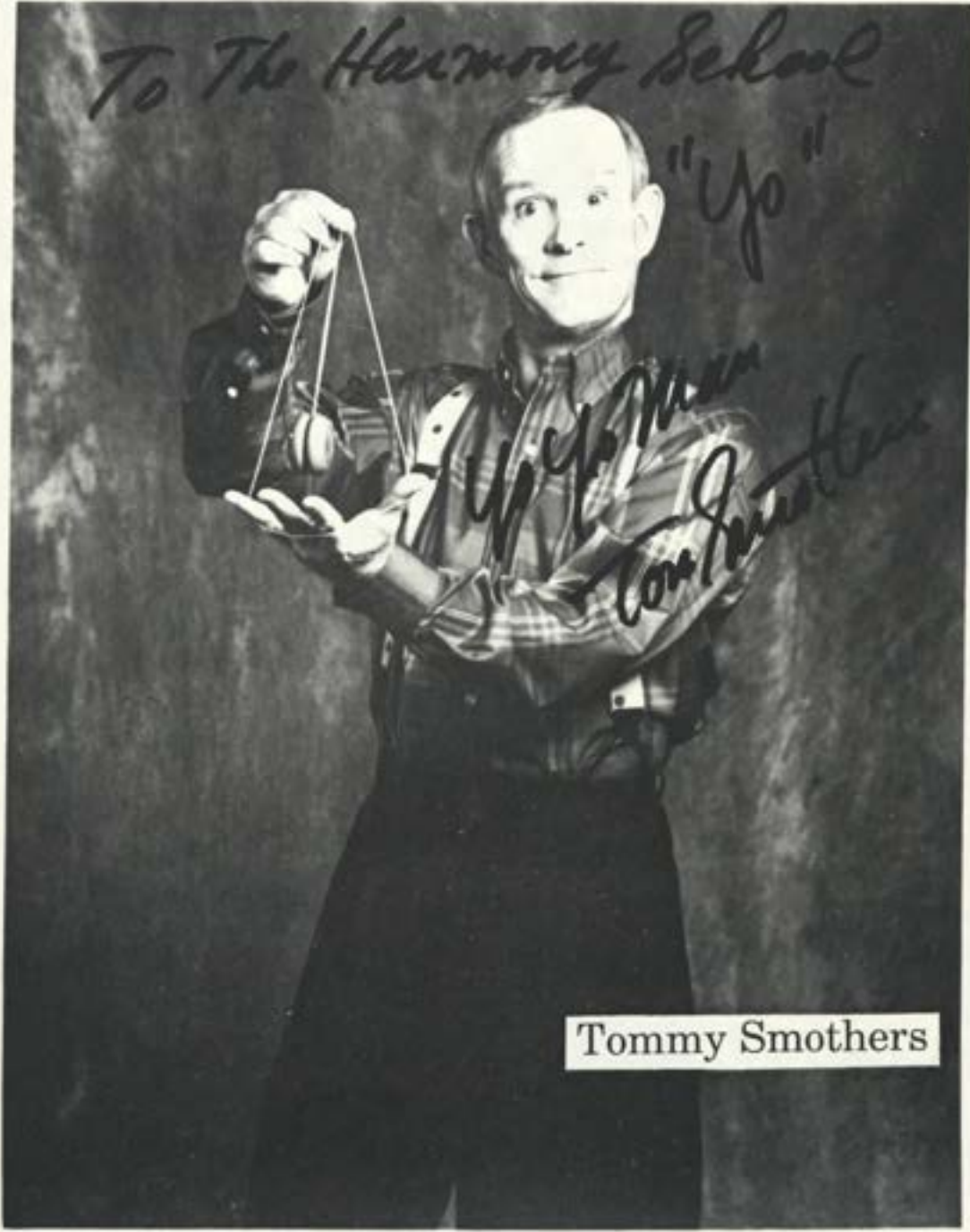

ORVILLE REDENBACHER--

"BEFORE" AND "AFTER"

One day, when you're sitting with a grandchild on each knee, your good old days will come to life in stories about watching the Berlin Wall crumble on live television, dancing to MTV all night at a pajama party or popping up snack food in a microwave oven.

At age 83, my most important "before" stories tell of a way of life before television and microwave ovens. They tell of experiences that have literally made me who I am and, in turn, made my life a success.

"Before" transports me back in time to my family's farm in Brazil, Indiana, where I was born in 1907. There, even when I was too young to help out, my toys would keep me occupied in the corn fields. Later, as a young boy working on the family farm, we awoke at 4 a.m. every day and worked until dark -- not only building a strong body, but strong work ethics.

There I learned persistence and dedication, two qualities of a homespun philosophy of business, and life that would follow me forever "after". Although my words -- "never say never", "integrity is a must", "anything worth having is worth striving for" -- may sound corny, the ideas behind them cannot fail to produce a "popping" success.

My formal education was in a one-room, brick schoolhouse where one teacher taught all eight grades. In addition to learning the art of concentration (from studying when others close by were reciting aloud), it was in that schoolhouse that I learned the importance of education. From there, I pursued a degree in Agriculture at Purdue University. Then, armed with a dream and the knowledge to make it come true, I developed the popcorn hybrid that produces my number one selling Gourmet Popping Corn.

While my most valued "before" stories may not incorporate changing technologies and trends, they do contain the key to a successful "after". And, when all is said and done, it's important to remember that times spent with loved ones, family and friends are the memories you will hold dearest. Those memories will be your greatest measure of success and personal fulfillment.

The HIP Program

The Harmony Independent Program (HIP) was established this fall as a second Harmony High School based on an individualized, independent study curriculum. The program was developed to meet the needs of those students who are more successful in one-on-one meetings with teachers, cannot attend full-time day school due to jobs or other factors, teen parents who lack child care, and others who, for whatever reason, need an alternative to the day school. HIP has had 10 students its first year and 3 staff people. As with any new program, there are a multitude of obstacles to overcome. HIP continues to evolve and we are all learning how to structure this new program so that the students can succeed and everyone feels good about classes, curriculum and program dynamics.

Curriculum is determined by the staff and students together. The students are given an outline of general courses they will need to accomplish to graduate. From this outline the students, working with the staff, develop course descriptions which mesh student interests with Harmony and Indiana state curriculum requirements. Many of these courses are interdisciplinary and all require a substantial amount of independent research. The HIP students are gaining expertise in research skills and familiarity with the I.U. library.

The students are also struggling to learn that this program requires a tremendous amount of personal responsibility and self-motivation as they need to determine their own study times; No teacher is there everyday to remind them to do their homework. HIP students and staff are learning together the limits on our expectations and the balance between independent study and teacher-supervised work time.

Despite the struggle and frustrations inherent in building a new program, this has been a rewarding year. We are confident that HIP will become a model alternative program.

How do you describe a new program and introduce a new student body to the Harmony Community? The HIP students (fondly known as "Hipsters") decided to write 2 fictional stories about the adventures of this new program. These are traveling stories, each person contributing a few lines as the evolving tale was passed around the room.

At the first group ("Council") meeting of the HIP students, Roc addressed the students using the analogy of the first American pilgrims making the westward journey. He talked about how these first settlers took on the challenge of their journey, using ingenuity and hard work to achieve their destination. He noted that many persevered and reached their destinations, while others died along the trail. Roc explained that these first HIP students are like those first settlers, they are trail blazers marking a new path, a new educational program for Harmony School. The stories show that the HIP students took this analogy to heart.

HIP

In the early days we were just a bunch of pioneers, making our harmonious way through the jungles of Bloomington. And on Friday we killed our fish. And it was good. Then we shoveled poop with our pooper scoop, and it was good. We also drank pee, and it was good. Also, we had a lot of fun.

Through all this fun in the jungle, we stuck together, making our way slowly toward the quicksand which lay, unavoidably, before us. Mike, our leader, was the first of our group to find himself neck deep in the slimy ooze of the Bloomington landfill. It was the HIP place to be, so we followed him fearlessly into the mire.

We looked at each other strangely trying to figure each other out. And analyzed ourselves. We've all fallen into the slimy ooze - some will not return. We're all trying to crawl out of this mess. Hopefully we'll continue to help each other and get out of this slime and reach a plateau.

And some geeks will get all messed up and steal their daddy's car and will take their mother's pills and get all messed up and end up dead. Dead in a ditch like their mothers told them they would.

So after they died, months later, they came back to life and tried to start all over again in the HIP program.

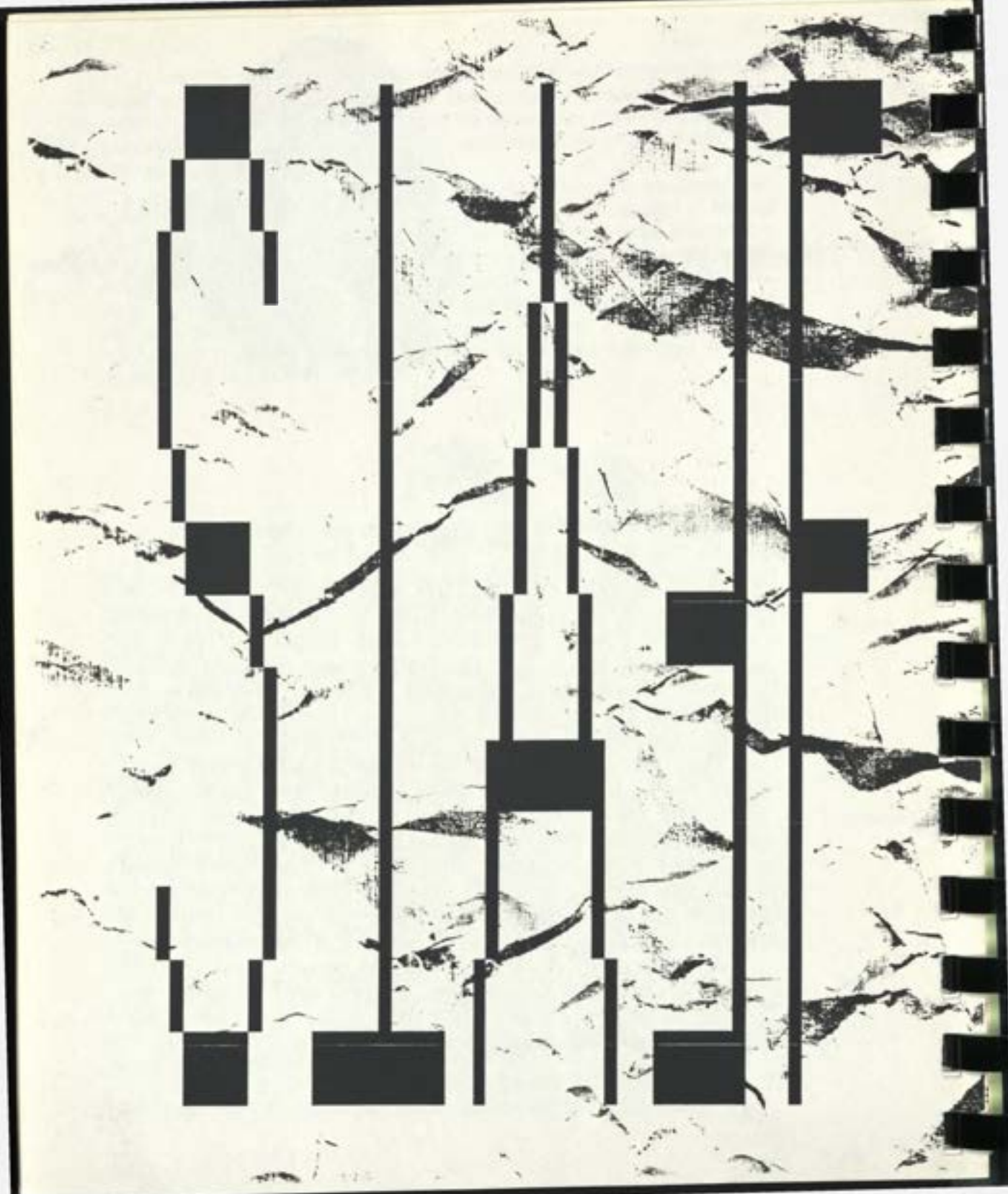


The Journey




I'd like to respond to Roc and Bill's questions in an integrated way.

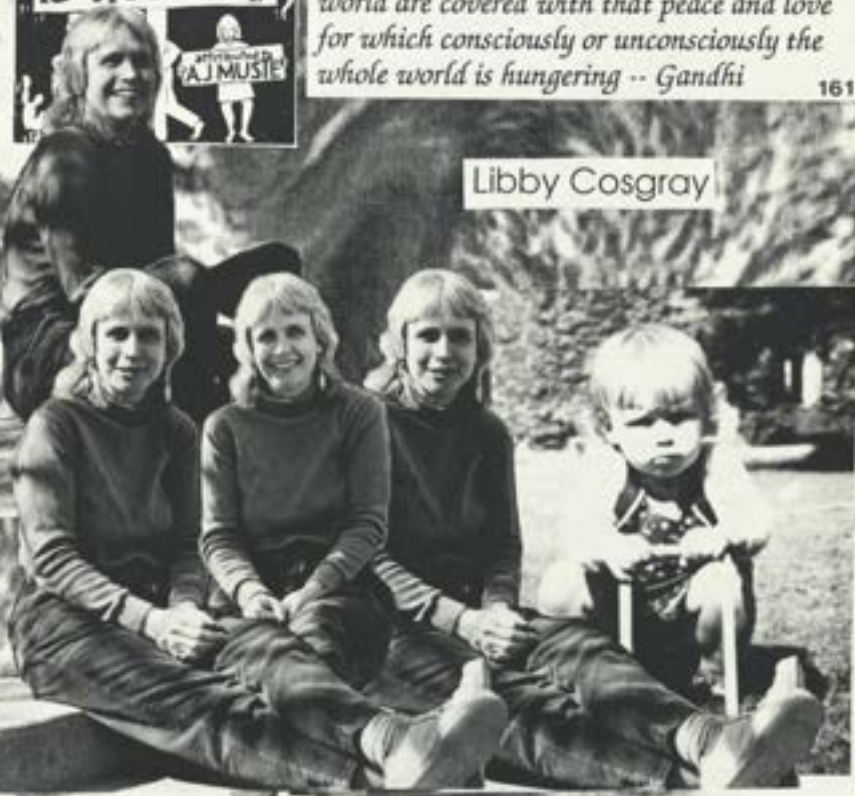

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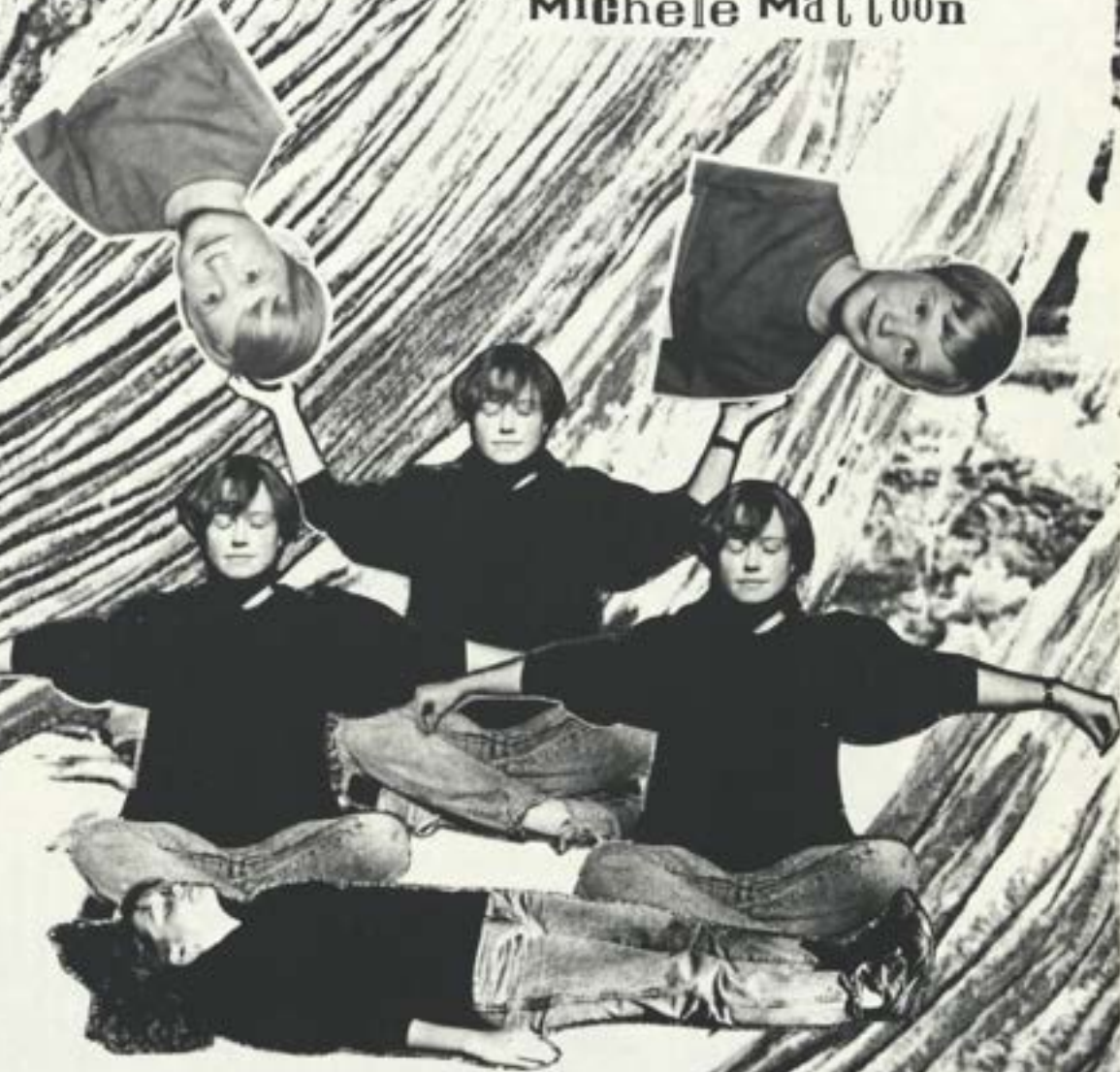



A dream came true when I traveled to Peru last summer. I was enriched. It was an adventure, food for my soul & spirit. I hiked up Machu Picchu, walked for 5 days deep into the jungle, saw an ancient Inca sun celebration, talked to women in the markets about weaving, family, & life. I also experienced the reality of incredible poverty, yet an enormous strength culturally. And from the community, I saw a sense of pride, belonging and mutual respect. These gentle people awoke much in me. A nightmare followed with the devastating war in the Middle East.

These two experiences made me look at the world and my place in it over again. Some of my feelings in Peru were similar to my outcry about the war.

America, the land of opportunity, democracy and freedom, the melting pot of many cultures seems to lack a respect ~~or~~ maybe an appreciation for different cultures. This lack of understanding can't be replaced with a feeling of greatness or strength and called "freedom." We are not free if we can't acknowledge true diversity in politics, religion, traditions & culture. Yes, we do measure-up everything to the norm. We eat beautiful, yellow corn--it tastes so sweet--once it was uneven and of many colors. Maybe it is different in taste like the luscious, wild strawberry compared to the perfect, watery mega-berry we find at the super-market now. This growing economic control numbs us, strips us of culture, leaving a deep spiritual gap that renders us empty. Only through diversity can there be an exchange which is necessary for growth.
